As a reminder, we are learning about prepositional phrases **in order to more easily find subject/verb agreement** in non-simple sentences. Remember, the subject will NEVER be in a prepositional phrase.

The SAT emphasizes **CONSISTENCY**.

- Are the subjects consistent with the verbs in the sentence?
- Are verbs consistent with other verbs in the sentence?
- Are nouns/pronouns consistent with other nouns/pronouns in the sentence?

**Directions:**

- 1.) Put **parentheses** around the prepositional phrases (remember, prep. phrases ALWAYS begin with a preposition)
- 2.) With the sentence that is left, **underline the subject once.**
- 3.) With the sentence that is left, **underline the verb twice.**
